MESSAGE OUTLINE—WEEK OF MAY 16, 2021 THIS IS THE LIFE: INTO AND OUT OF THIS WORLD

John 17:1-19 (NIV)

After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. ² For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. ³ Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. ⁴ I have brought you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. ⁵ And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began.

⁶ "I have revealed you to those whom you gave me out of the world. They were yours; you gave them to me and they have obeved your word. 7 Now they know that everything you have given me comes from you. 8 For I gave them the words you gave me and they accepted them. They knew with certainty that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me. ${}^{\circ}$ I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours. 10 All I have is yours, and all you have is mine. And glory has come to me through them. ¹¹ I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me. None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled.

¹³ "I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them. ¹⁴ I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. ¹⁵ My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified."

Life in Jesus is...

1. Out of this world. (v.1-10)

Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.

And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.

1 John 5:11-13 (NIV)

2. Into this world. (v.11-19)

So that they may be one as we are one... I have sent them into the world.

We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 1:14 (NIV)

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. John 17:20–21 (NIV)

SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS THIS IS THE LIFE: INTO AND OUT OF THIS WORLD

CONNECT

- If you were able, where would you go to escape and find respite from current realities?
- What is something so great, that you would describe it as being "out of this world"?

SPIRITUAL PRACTICE

Pray: Lord God, give us ears to hear what the Spirit is saying to us through your word. Guide us in everything we do with one another, we want to glorify you in our words and thoughts. Amen **Prepare:** Read John 17:1-19 aloud. Now write your name in the

blanks of each sentence. Individual Reflection: Silently read Jesus' prayer, using your name. Journal your responses.

	Reflect: In what area of your life are you longing to experience true oneness with Christ, so you can receive true joy?
5.	"My prayer is not that you take out of the world but that you protect from the evil one." (v. 15)
	Reflect: What do you think lesus sees that you need protection

from?

Prayer: Which aspect of Jesus' prayer means the most to you today? In response, write a short prayer, sharing whatever is on your heart.

Group Debrief: What was it like for you to personalize Jesus' words with your own name? In what way does reading it this way open you to a deeper experience of God's truth? How does it motivate you to live or think differently about your relationship with Jesus? With God?

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

- Reflecting on John 17 and this week's message, how is it stimulating your thoughts?
- How does Jesus pray for himself? What is his desire for his disciples then and now (see v. 20-21)?
- How does the content of Jesus' prayer line up with your own prayer requests? What is significant about that for you?
- How would you describe the kind of oneness that exists between Jesus and God? In what way does Jesus bridge the gap between the divine and human, God and humanity?
- From Jesus' perspective, what is eternal life? How is eternal life more than just "living forever"?
- How are the disciples to live in the tension between being "in the world" but not "of the world"? How do the disciples glorify Jesus like Jesus is glorying the Father?
- For what purpose was Jesus sent into the world? For what purpose does Jesus send his disciples (including us) into the
- In what ways can we become God's answer to Jesus' prayer?

Prayer Requests: Considering the week ahead, how can we pray for you?
