SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS—November 14, 2021 James: Humility and Wisdom of Jesus—Part 3: Mark 12:28-34

CONNECT WITH GOD (choose <u>one</u> of these practices that best suits your group or use a practice from a previous week)

• **Centering Prayer:** M. Basil Pennington said, In prayer we seek God. We do not seek peace, quiet, tranquility, enlightenment; we do not seek anything for ourselves. We seek to give ourselves...to God. He is the all of our prayer.

Explain: Today we are going to begin by centering our hearts on God. Each of us should pick a sacred word. This word is to remind us of who God is and who we are to God. (EX: forgiven, grace, love, mercy, joy, Jesus, etc.) In your heart and mind, offer that word to God as an act of prayer and as an opening of your heart to your Father. Spend three minutes of silence simply being open to the Spirit's presence. When you are distracted by something, recall your sacred word to refocus on the Lord. This centering prayer is not to empty your mind, but to focus your heart, soul, and spirit on our Great God.

- One Minute: Set a timer for one minute. Sit in silence, letting go of the anxieties of the day, the worries of tomorrow, and the urgency of the present. Allow the anxious thoughts to drift away and focus your heart on Jesus Christ.
- **Breath Prayer:** This ancient form of prayer is a reminder of the nearness of God in everyday life and his provision- even in each breath we take. As we breathe in, we pray in our mind and heart, Lord Jesus Christ... and as we exhale, pray, have mercy on me. Do this in silence, together at your own pace, until everyone has prayed/breathed this ten times.

CONNECT WITH EACH OTHER

Journaling: Many spiritual practices this year will require a journal. If you are a small group leader be prepared with paper and pen for those who are without. Please remember that there is no right way to journal. Journals can be intermittent, upside down, written, drawn, or doodled. They are a way to capture what God is doing in you over time. Journaling with your small group will include a prompt; however, in your time alone with God, allow the Spirit to be your leader.
