#### Personalizing the Psalms

This summer we are focusing on one Psalm per week. In your own time alone with God, consider using one or more of the practices to reflect on the Psalm. Take your journal with you wherever you go this summer. At the end of the summer you will have a journal full of your own reflections, thoughts and prayers!

- **Journaling:** Write out the Psalm in your journal. Make notes in the margins to amplify or clarify words. Be creative with doodling, drawing, highlighting words or phrases, collaging with cut-out words or pictures.
- **Reading:** Take time to slowly read aloud the Psalm. What words or phrases stand out to you? What questions do you have? What words or phrases repeat?
- Memorizing: Commit to memory one or more verses.
- **Praying:** How does this Psalm inspire praise, confession, lament, gratitude, or guidance for yourself, others or the world?

# Personalizing the Psalms
