DAILY LENTEN REFLECTIONS

During your time alone with God this Lenten season, journal on these themes and scripture verses.

HUMILITY What things are sources of pride for you? Examine your heart and confess whatever hinders you from reflecting God's image. *Hebrews 1:3, Isaiah 64:8*

SACRIFICE What could you give up for Lent that would create more space for time alone with God and help you identify with the suffering of Jesus? Use the desire for what you are missing (food, media, experience, etc.) to fuel your prayer and show love toward others.

SURRENDER What in your life can you surrender to God today? What do you sense God is making new in you? Slowly pray the Lord's Prayer. *Philippians 3:20-21*
