MESSAGE OUTLINE Hope Rising: Generosity and the Glory of God

Haggai 1:13-2:9 (NIV)

Then Haggai, the Lord's messenger, gave this message of the Lord to the people: "I am with you," declares the Lord. ¹⁴So the Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and the spirit of the whole remnant of the people. They came and began to work on the house of the Lord Almighty, their God, ¹⁵on the twenty-fourth day of the sixth month. In the second year of King Darius, ¹on the twenty-first day of the seventh month, the word of the Lord came through the prophet Haggai: ²"Speak to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, to Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and to the remnant of the people. Ask them, ³'Who of you is left who saw this house in its former glory? How does it look to you now? Does it not seem to you like nothing? ⁴But now be strong, Zerubbabel,' declares the Lord. 'Be strong, Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest. Be strong, all you people of the land,' declares the Lord, 'and work. For I am with you,' declares the Lord Almighty. 5'This is what I covenanted with you when you came out of Egypt. And my Spirit remains among you. Do not fear.' 6"This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'In a little while I will once more shake the heavens and the earth, the sea and the dry land. 7I will shake all nations, and what is desired by all nations will come, and I will fill this house with glory,' says the Lord Almighty. 8'The silver is mine and the gold is mine,' declares the Lord Almighty. 9'The glory of this present house will be greater than the glory of the former house,' says the Lord Almighty. 'And in this place I will grant peace,' declares the Lord Almighty."

1. Remembering the past glory of God. 'Who of you is left who saw this house in its former glory?'

One generation commends your works to another; they tell of your mighty acts. ⁵They speak of the glorious splendor of your majesty— and I will meditate on your wonderful works...¹⁷The Lord is righteous in all his ways and faithful in all he does. ¹⁸The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth. CONNECT WITH GOD (Just like last week, choose between the below practices of either listening or justice. If a different practice suits your group better, I encourage you to again practice Lectio Divina from a previous week)

Rhythms of Justice and Mercy (5-7 minutes)

Read: "Perhaps the rhythm that I find most challenging and most important, however, is God's heartbeat for justice and mercy. It doesn't come naturally to me. God's love for people who have been marginalized, discarded, and taken advantage of reverberates throughout the Bible...' (Deuteronomy 10:18-19, Psalm 146:7-8, Jeremiah 22:15-16, Matthew 25). www.crcna.org/FaithPracticesProject/justice-and-mercy/rhythms-justiceand-mercy

Reflect in writing or in prayerful contemplation: What does this quote stir in you? Has God's priority for justice and mercy become a daily rhythm in your life? In what ways might you shift your mindset and rhythms to allow the practice of justice to become a priority in your life?

Listening to God (5-7 minutes)

Alone: In a posture of stillness and openness, come to God with the intention to listen. Pray: "Lord, I am here. Quiet the noises and voices around me. Teach me to listen for You."

Journal: While you pray: listen and wait. Then, jot down any themes of images that come to your mind. Listening well also means listening with others and so you are encouraged to find a partner to share your experience.
