

Dear Church Family,

Over the past couple of years, our leadership has been asking, "What does it look like for our church to flourish? What is required of us as we take the next step of faithfulness?"

Flourishing as a church community means growing more and more in our love for God and others. It means receiving the generous love of God and sharing that love with our families, neighbors, friends, and fellow believers in ways that are uncommonly generous. This uncommon generosity from you, our church family, is what helps make our ministries flourish and thrive.

This phrase, "Your tithes, offerings and legacy gifts help us to be the intergenerational, transformational and missional church God has called us to be," is repeated week after week as we prepare to dedicate our financial gifts to God in worship. It's a phrase that reinforces three convictions I have as your pastor.

**First, it's your "gifts."** As disciples we give generously as a spiritual practice. This not only contributes to something in our church and the world, but it also to something in you: a surrendered heart toward God. We are what we practice.

**Second, your gifts include "tithes, offerings and legacy gifts."** Scripture describes the tithe as your regular, planned, percentage giving to the work of God through your church. Ten percent is a good goal—for all your giving to the church or a combination of gifts to the work of God in the world—to work toward. If you are new to giving, start small. Make your goal this year to contribute 1% of your income to SBPC. If you are experienced in giving, increase your percentage by 1-2% as a way of growing your trust in God.

Offerings are occasional or extra gifts motivated by additional income or because of a financial need of a particular ministry God has put on your heart. For example, year-end giving, including IRA distributions and gifts of stock, make a substantial difference in our church budgeted income that doubles in November and December.

Legacy gifts are planned estate gifts that demonstrate in perpetuity your commitment to supporting your church. In 2024, prayerfully consider making a goal to create or renew your estate documents to include a percentage of your estate or a dollar amount to benefit SBPC and the Kingdom Builder Foundation.

**Third, we strive to be "the church God has called us to be."** This is not a random descriptor of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church. It's actually very specific. We can see the ways we have grown intergenerationally from our youngest to our oldest. Gathering in worship or on the patio for lunch, we are a family. We are a transformational church that is growing more and more in our laws for God and each other.

that is growing more and more in our love for God and each other. We believe the Holy Spirit is at work conforming us to the image of Christ for the sake of others—which makes us a missional church. We are the body of Christ working together with each other and God to build up the church and bless the world.

As Amy and I complete our 20 years of service here at SBPC, we have seen the difference your generous gifts have made. From staff to facilities to ministries here and around the world, your gifts are overflowing hope. So, my prayer for us is the prayer of Paul to the churches in Rome:

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13 (NIV)

#### Dear Church Family,

The primary focus of SBPC's Session (made up of Elders and Pastors) is our ends—the purpose for why we exist as a church. Session defines our global end: "Our members, friends, and neighbors live as fully-devoted followers of Jesus Christ in growing community." In addition to focusing on this global end, we also deal with practical things, including monitoring our financial performance as a church and approving an annual budget. As stated in the PC(USA) Book of Order (G-3.0205):

The Session shall prepare and adopt a budget and determine the distribution of the congregation's benevolences. It shall authorize offerings for Christian purposes and shall account for the proceeds of such offerings and their disbursement.

Session does not just pass a budget and then wait 12 months to see how it went. The budget is just one part of a consistent monitoring process. It includes a sub-committee of Session, the Financial Review Committee (FRC), which meets monthly with our Senior Pastor, Mike McClenahan, and our Chief Financial Officer, Andrew Ruff. The FRC then presents the key takeaways of that review to the entire Session at its monthly meeting. Beyond that, Session meets with Andrew quarterly to ask questions and explore the numbers together. We also commission an annual financial review, which a Certified Public Accountant performs.

Last year was good overall, but it had some caution signs. Our tithes and offerings (regular giving as a congregation) finished \$400,000 below budgeted expectations. Our normal giving patterns are seasonal, which makes budgeting more complicated, and they are typically lower in the summer, followed by a significant spike in November and December. Last year, that spike was lower than the previous year. The good news from last year is that \$200,000 in additional income from the preschool and a reduction in budgeted expenses offset the shortfall in tithes and offerings. The preschool is at our offered capacity, and we have seen growth in enrollment for after-school programs. Our expenses grew substantially from Ministry Year 2022 but were still \$200,000 below our budgeted spending. Together, those additions and the shortfall in giving offset each other, and while that is not optimal, we did finish the year on budget with an excellent cash balance and full reserves.

We face significant challenges as we move into Ministry Year 2024 (MY24). Chief among them is inflation. It shows up in areas where we have limited control, like utilities, insurance, and maintenance contracts. It also shows up in areas where we have decisions like staff salaries. If we are not giving increases in a world where gas can cost over \$6 per gallon, the effective salaries that the church is paying are less than what they used to be. We are budgeting for an increase in tithes and offerings to keep pace, and we need everyone's help!

Here is some exciting news: we had 65 new members join our church last year! We are also adding new givers. In August, we added four first-time givers, and three of those givers signed up for recurring donations. Praise the Lord!

We are also asking our existing givers to contribute more as you are able. You have seen the videos over the summer and heard our Session members' voices. The need is great, and we are called to meet it. We are budgeting for an income increase of about \$300,000 from MY23 to MY24. We have been in MY23 since July 1 and are about \$23,000 ahead of budget for tithes and offerings. It is a great start! We are praying to keep that momentum going into the Christmas season and never to stop growing into the church God has called us to be.

We at Session are eager to see where God continues to lead us through this season— how it grows us individually in the personal spiritual disciplines of giving, surrender, and sacrifice; how it grows us together as a church community, uniting together to meet this challenge; and ultimately, how it glorifies God!
